Trash Derby Rules 1.7

- Debris can only be taken during designated collection hours: Sunrise to Sunset, Friday, May 3rd, 2023 and Sunrise to Sunset, Saturday, May 4th 2023
- 2. Final weigh in is 4:00 6:00 PM, Saturday May 4th, 2023
- 3. ONLY remove debris in permitted areas, areas where permits are not required, or private areas with permission
 - a. See Florida Keys National Marine Sanctuary (FKNMS) and Florida Fish and Wild Commission (FWC) permits for details, available on Participant Info Page
- 4. ONLY remove debris that can be removed by hand or with the assistance of a lift bag
- 5. NO removal of debris embedded in the seafloor which requires digging or excavating
- 6. NO debris with live coral on it
 - a. It is illegal to touch, remove, or damage coral within the FKNMS
 - b. Sponges should be removed underwater prior to debris removal
- 7. NO in season fishable traps, potential historical artifacts, or un-permitted removals
 - a. NO <u>unidentifiable</u> glass bottles, nails, copper sheathing, pottery, etc
 - i. Focus on removing derelict fishing gear and plastic
 - b. See FWC permit on Participant Info Page for authorized trap removal details
 - i. <u>In Season:</u> stone crab and blue crab traps
 - ii. Out of season: Lobster traps
- 8. Debris removed with coral or unpermitted trap removals will NOT count toward the derby and teams will be penalized or disqualified if removed depending on the severity
- 9. Debris must be weighed and recorded with an ICARE volunteer
 - a. See Participant Info Page for designated debris drop off locations and times
- 10. All existing federal, state, and local laws must be followed
- 11. All media coverage (press releases, video/photo, social media, or other means) related to the Trash Derby MUST include the acknowledgment: "Activities occurred within NOAA Florida Keys National Marine Sanctuary under permit"
- 12. Anchoring in a SPA or the Western Sambo Ecological Reserve is only authorized if in sand and a mooring buoy is not available
- 13. Land/Shore Division ONLY shoreline or land based debris
- 14. Private Boat & Dive Operators permits must be present during activity
 - a. Can remove submerged and land debris (must be kept separate)
 - b. Each team MUST submit their submerged debris data via Marine Debris Tracker.
 - Use your team's name/organization as your username AND include the words "ICARE Trash Derby".
- 15. Land/Shore & Private Boat Divisions: No limit on team size. Prizes awarded lbs/person.
- 16. Every participant must sign ICARE Trash Derby Participation Waiver before the derby
- 17. REQUIRED CAPTAIN'S MEETING: 6:00-7:30 PM Thursday, May 2nd, 2023, Bud N' Mary's Marina (79851 Overseas Hwy, Islamorada, FL 33036) or virtually (Zoom)
 - a. At least one participating team member MUST attend the Captain's meeting
 - b. Pick up debris collection equipment, permits, and derby shirts during check-in at the Captain's meeting OR email trashderby@gmail.com to schedule early pick up the week of the derby
